Critical Care Medical Equipment's worth Rs 208 Crores have been procured under the Jhelum Tawi Flood Recovery Project funded by the World Bank. The equipment's have been procured by the JKMSCL (Jammu and Kashmir Medical Supplies Corporation) which has been designated as the Project Implementation Unit for the procurement of about 42 critical care medical equipments under USD 50 million CERC (Contingency Emergency Response Component) of JTFRP. The said equipments are being provided to various major and peripheral hospitals across the UT to provide the quality health care facilities to the people of U.T at their nearest hospitals and to reduce the referral of the critically ill patients to the tertiary care hospitals. The 1st instalment of 17 medical equipments which include the 40 Haemodialysis machines, 300 Oxygen concentrators, 20 Haemtology Analysers, 75 High Flow Nasal Oxygen Therapy Units 240 Intensive Care Beds, 9 mobile X-Ray units, 300 cardiac monitors, 40 Paediatric etc. and the equipments are being provided to different hospitals across the U.T
