

LG inaugurates modernized govt silk weaving factory

Srinagar, Aug 5: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Thursday stated that the govern-ment would begin the branding of Kashmir silk to provide it an international market

He stated this after inaugurating the modernized and upgraded gov-

ernment silk weaving fac-tory at Rajbagh, Srinagar marking an important step towards the revival and holistic development of the silk industry in UT.

"We will soon launch Rajbagh Silk as a new brand for Kashmir silk. Moreover, the Tourism department will work in tandem with the

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Project (JTFRP). Under the upgraded in plan, a new factory with state-ofthe-art preparatory and weaving machinery has been installed.

Implemented focusing on making the organization as a profitable and
viable entity, besides providing livelihood support to the marginalized
sections of the society, especially those associated with the cocoon
rearing and production of wool, the Lt Governor said.

The revamped government silk factory would provide a cocoon consumption market to approximately 50000 cocoon growers or farmers of
the Kashmir division. Pertinently, in absence of such a big consumption
centre for the local cocoon, the farmers were exploited by middlemen
and a major quantity of cocoon would get exported to other parts of the
country without any value addition.

The government silk weaving factory Rajbagh would now be capable
of producing 4,50,000 meters of silk fabric per annum creating a viable
economic cycle and employment opportunities both directly and indirectly. Further, the government silk weaving factory Jammu established
in the year 2020 was providing direct market to the cocoon rearers of
the Jammu division, added the Lt Governor.

In the second phase, the industries department would restore two
heritage buildings of the silk factory. This would have a design studio,
quality control lab and areas for tailoring where customers could select
the fabric and talk to the master tailors, it was informed.

Later, the Lt Governor also interacted with the artisan clusters of
willow wicker (Ganderbal), papler mache (Zadlbal), crewel

products.

A presentation was also made by the experts of the consultancy engaged by JTFRP for the adaptive reuse of the Rajbagh silk factory and the steps proposed for the retrofitting of the old factory, using the old campus for dyelng, varincertification and other beautification measures, besides linking the campus with the tourist circuit.
